Registration and Ticket Sales for the Convention:

Discounted rates are available for Rotarians who register for the Convention before 31 March 2001. After the March deadline, registrations will be accepted only on site and at a higher fee. The registration fee is payable in U.S. dollars with a personal or travelers check or Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Diners Club, or JCB credit card.

Convention registrants who wish to attend the International Institute must pay an additional registration fee.

Tickets will be offered for several convention luncheons and other events. They may be purchased ahead of time by com-

pleting the RI and Host Organization ticket order forms that accompany your registration confirmation. Both the RI and Host Organization ticket order forms are also available for download. The ticket order forms will also be included with your registration confirmation and should be completed after the confirmation is received. Please note that you must already be registered for the convention in order for the forms to be processed. Any form submitted to either Rotary International or the Host Organization without a registration confirmation number will not be processed. For events that are not sold out, tickets will be sold on site on a first-come, first-served basis.

Rotary International produces a wide range of educational and promotional materials in support of its membership and programs. These include books, brochures, manuals, and other printed matter as well as videos and other audiovisual productions, all of which are listed in the *RI Catalog*. A copy of the current edition of the catalog can be requested from the RI Order Desk, One Rotary Center, 1560 Sherman Avenue, Evanston, Illinois 60201, USA (telephone: 847-866-4600; fax 847-866-3276). The RI Faxback service provides delivery of some frequently requested publications.

RI also publishes two widely circulated periodicals: *Rotary World* and *The Rotarian*.

Rotary World is a newspaper published five times a year and distributed to all Rotary clubs as well as to current and past RI officers.

Definition of Rotary:

Rotary is an organization of business and professional leaders united worldwide, who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill

The Rotarian is part of an official network of Rotary magazines.

RI also provides the *Rotary News Basket*, a weekly on-line newsletter providing current information on Rotary activities.

Navigating the Global Network, published three times a year, is directed at other humanitarian organizations and government agencies that might wish to partner with Rotary in service initiatives.

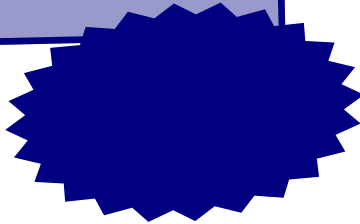
