May Meeting Updates...

July 1, 2003—Mike McCormick gave a presentation on business persons who influenced the history of Terre Haute.

July 8, 2003—Tim Fagg from Lighthouse Mission was the program. They are celebrating 113 of ministry. People at the mission are there mainly for drug/alcohol abuse or loss of job/housing. Programs are designed to help get people back on their feet and to treat/resolve their problems. They work with the Terre Haute Housing Authority to help with housing while getting back into the community. Other programs include GED, bible study, work programs, and clothing store. Currently the mission serves 109 people at 2 sites: 57 men, 27 women, and 24 kids. Average age of resident is 19-35 years old. Last year mission provided 665 baskets of food for Thanksgiving and gave 380 youth Christmas presents.

July 15, 2003—Jim Willis, Vice President of Customer Relations, Cinergy. Cinergy has ask for there 1st price increase since 1996 to cover over \$1.8 billion in cost related to pollution controls, power supply, and new delivery systems. Average power demand increases about 2% each year.

July 22, 2003—Bob McClaughlin from DADC was the program. Terre Haute plant is largest and most produc-

tive, and has largest sales of any Sony/DADC plants worldwide. CD sales are down due to internet, file sharing, economy, and slow down in music industry. DVD performance is strong. Time from theater to DVD is as little as 90 days. CD lines have went from 96 to 48, while DVE has gone from 28 to 109. Daily DVD production is 1.5 million/day and CD production is about 1/3 that. Plant employees about 1000 people and has had a billion dollar effect on the Terre Haute economy since opening.

July 29, 2003—Libby Ciecuirra spoke of her fathers trip though Europe as part of the 131st infantry battalion in WWII, from the shores of Normandy just past D-Day until her returned to the United States. He was a medical officer on a front line casualty medical group, often only a few 100 feet from the front lines.

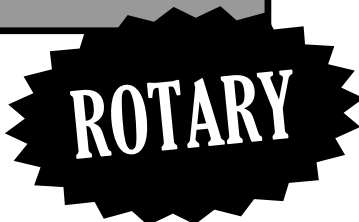
