Board of Director's Monthly Meeting Update

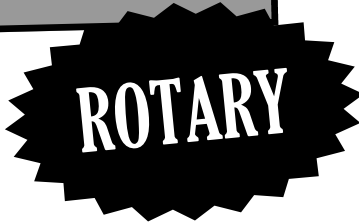
- Attendance for January was 74.3% with YTD at 61.0%.
