August Meeting Updates...

Aug 6: Becky Buse, Executive Director YWCA 100th anniversary in Wabash Valley. YW former building (1908) held areas first indoor pool. YTEENS program begun in 1916 as Terre Haute Girls Reserve is one of 8 in nation.

Aug 13: Lynn Van Etten, pilot, participated in the Women's Cross-Country Air Race. First race was 1929 in which Amelia Erhart competed. Competitors fly low as possible to conserve fuel. Lynn's team included an octogenarian. They finished in 6th place.

Aug 20: Vigo Cty Prosecutor Bob Wright said his office has a budget of \$1.2 million, 30 employees and 14 lawyers. Cases number around 577/yr and each last about 4 days. Because only 104 could be scheduled annu-

ally, plea bargaining keeps jails from becoming overcrowded and is used with lesser, non-violent crimes. Bob's guiding principle is to do no more harm than is necessary, and to try to get an individual to stop repeating an offense.

August 27: Joint meeting with Kiwanis at the Elks Club. Chuck Shutt invited National Guard Master Sergeant Jim Chesterson and his Crossroads Brass ensemble to entertain. Chuck also performed along with Kathy Sponsler and Russ Howard. Following lunch, 24 golfers played a mixed scramble. Each club agreed to donate \$250 to Riley Children's Hospital.
